Summary

Indications and Usage: Hemophilia A & B with factor VIII inhibitors

Dosage Forms: Injectable, labeled with correctional units of factor VIII (8mg/mL)

Recommended Dosage: General: 50-100 units/kg (maximum 200 units/kg). Dose may vary based on site of bleeding (e.g. joint hemorrhage, mucous membrane bleeding, soft tissue hemorrhage, etc.)

Common Adverse Drug Reactions: Blood pressure fluctuations, flushing, headache, rash, nausea, fever.

Contraindications: Disseminated intravascular coagulation, fibrinolysis, patients with a normal coagulation mechanism, hypersensitivity to any component of the product.

Manufacturer: Baxter BioScience

Analysis: Feiba VH has FDA approved dosing ranges specific for various types of hemorrhages associated with hemophilia A & B, in addition to dosing guidelines for hemophilia maintenance. Autoplex® T contains the same active ingredients as Feiba VH, however, Autoplex® T is also FDA indicated for prophylactic use and is more cost effective.
